'START (From L., GERALD appears, a tabloid newspaper in his hand. He reads aloud from it.)

GERALD. Katz is eating his morning cereal in front of his television set. He is watching—Tessie Cat?—(SAM laughs.)—who says: "Dear viewers—how will you ever amount to anything if you don't stop wasting time with low-brow pursuits like television and start doing something worthwhile with your lives. I mean, you're never going to become rich and famous like me sitting home and watching stupid shows like this one"—(SAM laughs.) And Katz says, "So what else is new?" (a beat) Incredible. (He walks into the new set which has moved on.)

Scene 3

TESS' office: consisting of an outer, secretary's (GERALD's) office, and TESS' private one.

At Rise: GERALD crosses to his desk, still studying the tabloid newspaper he is reading.

Gerald. Tessie Cat. I don't believe it. (The phone rings and he answers it.) Miss Harding's office—No, she's not in at the moment, who's calling?—Oh, I'm so sorry, senator, I didn't recognize your voice. How are things in Washington?—No, of course we wouldn't mind if you called collect from now on—The comic strip? No, I'm positive she hasn't seen that yet. No, she couldn't have, senator, she's been at the Indian Consulate all afternoon interviewing Mother Teresa—It's her first television interview since she won the Nobel Peace Prize—No, I meant Mother Teresa. Miss Harding hasn't won it. Yet—(He turns to the door.) Hold on, senator, I think I hear her—(He quickly hides the newspaper. Then TESS enters, all business.)

Tess. Get Larry for me in Colorado. And hold all calls. (Without stopping she sails through, into her own office.)
